Chesapeake Beach Explorer Saturday, April 2, 2022

Following up on last year's DCNRHS virtual presentation, we will explore the history and Right of Way (R.O.W.) of the **Chesapeake Beach Railway** in person! **Using your own car**, on April 2 (rain date April 9) we'll start this full day tour at 9:45 AM with a visit to the **Chesapeake Beach Railway Museum** in Chesapeake Beach, MD for a docent led tour focusing on the history of this railroad, including historic photographs and the **operating model railroad layout**. **Chesapeake Beach** was a resort town back in the 1920's and 30's and the railway provided access for tourists as well as for "sportsmen" to hunt at **Jug Bay**.

Following lunch at nearby establishments including the Rod and Reel (next door to the museum, lunch not included) we will make our way to the site of the **Pindell Station and Freight House** for a docent-led site tour. The station is long gone but the freight house ruins as well as some of the nearby residences still exist. Using large scale historic photographs, we will set the scene to the 1920's.

Next, we'll make our way to the **Jug Bay Wetlands Sanctuary** to walk that portion of the R.O.W. contained within the sanctuary. The parking at this site is included in the trip cost. Jug Bay Wetland Sanctuary contains the R.O.W. leading from the site of the **Pindell Freight House** to the site of the **Patuxent River turntable bridge** (yes, the pivot is still in the middle of the river) as well as an astonishing variety of wildlife. Bring your binoculars for a view of the turntable pivot as well as the many birds (bald eagles and ospreys a definite possibility) and other wildlife. A park ranger will lead the R.O.W. tour with a focus on the railroad history. The walk on the trail to the **Patuxent River** from the parking lot is approximately 1.5 miles roundtrip, very flat but not paved and can be muddy.

On our return from the Patuxent River bridge site at approximately 4 pm, there will be the option of a selfguided walk to the nearby **beaver ponds** or for an additional three-mile hike on the rest of **the R.O.W. back to Pindell Freight House** (this trail is not as easy and requires climbing steep staircases where trestles are missing).

Tour participants must be able to stand for duration of the tour segments and walk to the various locations. DCNRHS requires those physically challenged individuals requiring special assistance to be accompanied by someone who is able to assist them.
